Narrative

Assignment:

On Saturday July 21, 2018 I was assigned to the patrol division of the Riverside Police department as a Patrol Supervisor. I was in full uniform and driving a marked black and white Riverside police vehicle. At 1953 hours, I was dispatched to assist Riverside Sheriff deputies who were in pursuit of a vehicle traveling west bound on Van Buren at a high rate of speed and shooting at the deputies.

Arrival:

While en-route to the location RPD Dispatch continued to provide up dated locations for the pursuit as it traversed city streets. As I proceeded towards the latest location, I heard via the radio that other RPD supervisors and the watch commander had already caught up to the pursuit and began coordinating responding units.

Investigation:

Hearing that the pursuit was headed towards the area of Lincoln Avenue and Van Buren Blvd, I drove to the location in an attempt to get ahead of it in order to clear the intersection . Upon arrival in the area, I realized the pursuit had already driven through the area and was continuing west bound on local streets. I again decide to jump ahead of the pursuit and drove to the area of Tyler and Indiana Ave . Upon arrival in the location, I contacted a CHP officer who was stopped on the west bound off ramp at Tyler speaking with a transient who was panhandling. I advised him of the details regarding the pursuit that was possibly headed his way. After speaking with The CHP officer I decided to clear the call due to the number of supervisors that were already involved in the pursuit.
