10 **Narrative:**

12 **On Friday, July 20, 2018, at about 1946 hours, I was assigned to RPD's METRO team. During this**
13 **time, we had just completed tactics training at Norte Vista High School. Upon leaving the school, I**
14 **heard RPD dispatch broadcast a pursuit that was nearing the city limits. The suspect had fled from**
15 **law enforcement officers from the Riverside Sheriff's Office and was shooting at the officers. The**
16 **suspect vehicle was approaching on the north bound 215 Freeway from Nuevo Rd.**
17

18 **Officer Park, who was driving our marked unit, contacted Sgt. Dehdashtian by phone and advised**
19 **him of the circumstances. Sgt. Dehdashtian gave us permission to head toward the last known area**
20 **to assist officers.**
21

22 **We monitored the pursuit which neared the area of Arlington Ave and California Ave. We**
23 **watched as the suspect vehicle passed us traveling west on Arlington Ave on the east bound lanes of**
24 **travel. The vehicle had to stop due to head on traffic. From our vehicle, I heard 1-2 gun shots from**
25 **the direction of where the suspect vehicle came to rest. We exited our unit, as did several other**
26 **officers, who ran toward the shooting. I observed from our vehicle that numerous Officers were**
27 **near the suspect vehicle.**

29 **Officer Park and Sgt. Elliot ordered several officers to back away from the suspect vehicle so we**
30 **(METRO officers) could conduct a high risk stop of the suspect and his vehicle. While setting up**
31 **our positions for the high risk stop, I saw the driver's door of the suspect vehicle was open, and I**
32 **could see only the suspect's leg.**
33

34 **For the high risk stop, I took position behind the suspect vehicle at a marked unit that was about a**
35 **car length behind the suspect vehicle. I was at the front passenger side of the marked unit.**
36

37 **Using the PA of the marked unit, Officer Park gave verbal commands for several minutes, while we**
38 **awaited our Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV). From outside the vehicle, no officers involved could**
39 **see the suspect's hands. The RPD air unit could only see the suspect leaning toward the passenger**
40 **side of the vehicle from the driver's seat.**
41

42 **A plan was devised to visually clear the suspect vehicle using the ARV.**
43

44 **Our position(s) at the high risk stop were relinquished by assisting SWAT personnel as we**
45 **prepared to execute our plan to clear the vehicle.**

1 Once set, the team (listed above) made our approach while inside the ARV on the passenger side of
2 the suspect vehicle. Officer Newton drove up next to the vehicle, and I was able to see inside the
3 front passenger window which was down. I saw the suspect, who was leaning towards the front
4 passenger seat but still partially in an upright position. The suspect had blood around his head and
5 body, but I was unable to tell from where it was coming from. I was unable to see the suspect's
6 right hand. No one inside the ARV could visibly see the suspect's right hand. Officer Soria was
7 assigned to deploy less lethal munitions at the suspect to attempt to get a response from him.
8 Officer Soria loaded a single bean bag round into the shotgun's chamber which I verified. See his
9 report for details.

10
11 Officer Soria deployed the less lethal round and I saw that the suspect did not react to it. After the
12 less lethal deployment, K-9 Officer Feimer deployed his K9 at the suspect. I was unable to see
13 where the K9 bit the suspect. Once the K9 released, it returned to its handler. The K9 deployment
14 appeared to move the suspect enough, to cause the suspect vehicle to slowly move forward due to it
15 still being in drive. Officer Newton drove the ARV in front of the suspect vehicle to block it from
16 traveling any further, which it did not.

17
18 Sergeant Dehdashtian, Officers Park, Monreal, Carmona, Wright, and Soria exited the ARV and
19 cleared the vehicle. Once the suspect vehicle was cleared, we remained at the scene awaiting
20 further instructions.

22 We were cleared from the scene at 2230 hours by Sgt. Dedashtain.
