Evidence:

The incident was recorded via my department issued body worn camera and downloaded under the given file number (P18-135608).

Narrative:

On 07-20-18, Officer Monreal and I were working uniformed patrol in full police uniform in a marked Riverside police unit in the City and County of Riverside (State of California). At approximately 1946 hours, dispatch broadcasted that a Riverside County Sheriff's unit was in pursuit into the City of Riverside of a 246 PC suspect vehicle (Chrysler model). Dispatch advised the suspect had fired shots (unknown firearm make / model) at the pursuing units.

I activated my overhead emergency lights and siren and proceeded to the area of Streeter Ave. and Arlington Ave. As I was driving S/B Streeter Ave. from Sierra Ave. I heard an officer broadcast "shots fired" and units were setting up for a felony stop.

I drove my police unit to the area of the termination point and positioned it in the W/B traffic lanes of Arlington Ave., just Northeast of the suspect vehicle. I exited my police unit and provided lethal cover of the passenger side of the vehicle with my department issued Colt Commando M4.

While on scene, I could see the suspect vehicle was stopped in the E/B traffic lanes of Arlington Ave. facing W/B. The vehicle was resting against the driver side of a Black SUV (sport utility vehicle). The front right passenger side window was rolled down and the right rear window was partially shattered. I could not see the suspect.

A short time later, Officer Park (see his report for details) began making PA announcements to the suspect inside the vehicle. I did not see any movement from within the suspect vehicle.

A short time later, Sgt. Dehdashtian arrived on scene and requested Officer Monreal and I consolidate behind the ARV (armored rescue vehicle). I then entered into the ARV and Sgt. Dehdashtian devised a tactical plan. I was assigned to maintain lethal cover on the suspect from the passenger side of the vehicle.

As the ARV approached the passenger side of the suspect vehicle, I could see the suspect seated in the drivers seat slumped over the center console with his left hand lying near the center console. I could see the suspect's right arm lying on the front right passenger seat but I could not see his right hand. The suspect had what appeared to be blood on his head and t-shirt.

A short time later, Officer Soria was tasked with deploying less than lethal munitions to the suspect (see his report for details). I heard Officer Soria announce, "deploying less lethal" three times prior to delivering one less than lethal round to the suspect. The suspect did not respond to the less than lethal deployment.

Officer Feimer deployed his K9 from the rear of the suspect vehicle. I did not see any movement from the suspect.

On Sgt. Dehdashtian's command, we exited the ARV to take the suspect into custody. As I exited the rear of the ARV, I provided lethal cover on the suspect from the passenger side of the vehicle. I positioned myself next to the passenger side "B" pillar and could see the suspect's right hand lying on the front right passenger side seat. Lying next to his right hand was a Black semi-automatic pistol with what appeared to have a "double feed" (a condition where two projectiles attempt to enter the chamber of the pistol at the same time causing a stoppage).

The remainder of METRO Officers approached the drivers side of the vehicle and covered down on the suspect. Sgt. Dehdashtian requested RFD personnel to the scene. I saw a single RFD personnel approach the driver side of the vehicle and check on the suspect. RFD pronounced the suspect at that time. I held my position at the scene until, I was relieved by Sgt. Dehdashtian.
