9 Narrative:

10 On 07-20-18 at about 1946 hours, partner Officers Macias #1434, Wright #1453 and I were assigned to
11 the Riverside Police Department's METRO Team and working uniformed patrol in a marked Riverside
12 Police unit. On the above date and time, I heard Police Dispatch broadcast information regarding a
13 vehicle pursuit on the 215 freeway at Nuevo. Police Dispatch advised the Riverside County Sheriff's
14 Department was in pursuit of a Chrysler northbound on the 215 freeway and an occupant inside the
15 Chrysler was shooting at officers. Within several minutes, Police Dispatch advised the Chrysler exited
16 Van Buren Blvd. from the 215 freeway and turned west towards Riverside city limits.

18 We monitored the pursuit in our marked unit and heard Sgt. Elliott broadcast that Riverside Police was
19 taking over the pursuit as the vehicle continued west on Van Buren Blvd. Due to the severity of the crime
20 and the suspect being armed while showing a propensity for violence towards police officers, I notified
21 my immediate supervisor, Sgt. Dehdashtian, and received authorization to monitor the pursuit from a
22 reasonable distance. We remained at a distance where we could respond and provide assistance to
23 pursuing police units throughout the duration of the pursuit.

25 As the pursuit neared the area of Arlington Ave. and California Ave., we watched the suspect vehicle pass
26 us traveling west on Arlington Ave. in the eastbound lanes of travel. Numerous marked units passed us as
27 it pursued the Chrysler towards California Ave. From my vantage point, it appeared the suspect vehicle
28 began to slow and was forced to stop due to oncoming traffic. I pulled onto Arlington Ave. and exited my
29 police unit. As I began running towards the area where the pursuit had terminated, I heard two gunshots
30 from the direction of where the suspect vehicle came to rest and learned an officer involved shooting had
31 occurred.

33 I ran to a police unit that had stopped about a car length behind the suspect vehicle and observed
34 numerous officers taking positions around the suspect vehicle. The Chrysler's driver side door was open
35 and I could only see the suspect's legs.

36
37 I assisted Sgt. Elliott at the scene and began coordinating a high risk stop with METRO and collateral
38 Riverside Police SWAT personnel. After setting up an arrest team on the driver side of the marked police
39 unit that was behind the suspect vehicle, I used the unit's P.A. system and began making announcements
40 to the suspect. I made numerous P.A. announcements and the suspect did not respond. Air-1 was
41 overhead and also advised the suspect was not moving.

43 Based on the circumstances and the suspect being armed, the armored rescued vehicle (ARV) was
44 summoned to the scene. Collateral SWAT personnel took over our positions on the high risk stop and
45 members of the METRO Team put together a tactical plan to approach the suspect vehicle using the ARV.

1 The ARV pulled alongside the passenger side of the Chrysler and we could see a lone male suspect
2 slumped over the center console and unresponsive. The suspect's right arm was extended across the front
3 passenger seat and we could not see his right hand or a gun from our vantage point. To illicit a response,
4 Officer Soria deployed a less lethal round at the suspect from the ARV. See Officer Soria's supplemental
5 report for details.

6
7 The suspect was unresponsive to the less lethal round, at which point Officer K. Feimer deployed his K-9
8 into the vehicle. See his supplemental report for details.

9
10 After the less lethal options did not illicit a response from the suspect, Sgt. Dehdashtian made the
11 determination to have the team exit the ARV and take the suspect into custody. After going over our
12 designated roles and responsibilities, members of the METRO Team exited the ARV and approached the
13 suspect vehicle. I approached on the driver side along with Officer Monreal and observed a male suspect
14 slumped over the center console. The suspect was bleeding from the left side of his head. Officer
15 Carmona, who was on the passenger side of the suspect vehicle, told me that a gun was on the front
16 passenger seat next to the suspect's right hand. The suspect remained unresponsive and I noticed the
17 vehicle's ignition was still in drive. I reached into the suspect vehicle, placed the transmission into park,
18 and turned off the engine. After clearing the trunk of the vehicle, Riverside Fire Department personnel
19 entered the scene and pronounced the suspect deceased. I remained at the vehicle at the direction of
20 supervision until I was directed to exit the crime scene by Sgt. Dehdashtian.
