1 **Narrative:**

2
3 On 07-20-18 at about 1946 hours, I was assigned to the Riverside Police Department's
4 METRO Team and working uniformed patrol in a marked Riverside Police unit. On the
5 above date and time, I heard Police Dispatch broadcast information regarding a
6 vehicle pursuit on the 215 freeway at Nuevo. Police Dispatch advised the Riverside
7 County Sheriff's Department was in pursuit of a Chrysler northbound on the 215 freeway
8 and an occupant inside the Chrysler was shooting at officers. Within several minutes,
9 Police Dispatch advised the Chrysler exited Van Buren Blvd. from the 215 freeway and
10 turned west towards Riverside city limits.

11
12 As Police units pursued the vehicle, I monitored the pursuit's direction of travel while
13 staying in the area of Magnolia and Monroe. As the pursuit headed eastbound through
14 the City, I began driving to the area of California and Arlington. While traveling
15 eastbound on Arlington from California, Air 1 advised the suspect was traveling
16 westbound on Arlington from El Molino. I pulled onto the south curb of Arlington and
17 observed the suspect vehicle traveling towards me then pass me at a high rate of
18 speed driving on the wrong side of the road.

19
20 Seconds after the vehicle drove past me, I heard what sounded like a single gunshot. I
21 looked back and observed the suspect vehicle had collided into another vehicle, and
22 appeared to be stuck. I then exited my vehicle and began running towards the
23 suspect vehicle. While running towards the vehicle, I heard what sounded like 2
24 additional gun shots and observed several officers surrounding the suspect vehicle. I
25 then took cover to the front of a vehicle directly east of the suspect vehicle and began
26 coordinating with officers on scene to move back away from the vehicle.

27
28 Once all Officers moved away from the suspect vehicle, I was assigned to the arrest
29 team as the designated less lethal option. I went back to my unit and retrieved my
30 40mm less lethal launcher. I then maintained my position as less lethal coverage until
31 the ARV arrived on scene.

32
33 Once the ARV arrived on scene, I transitioned from the arrest team and was moved to
34 the ARV team. While at the ARV, SWAT personnel formulated a tactical plan to move
35 up towards the suspect vehicle using the ARV, to gain a better vantage point of the
36 suspect as well as clear the vehicle.

37
38 As part of the ARV team, I was assigned as the primary less lethal option. Due to the
39 small size of the port holes on the ARV, I transitioned from the 40mm launcher to the less
40 lethal shotgun equipped with drag stabilized bean bag rounds.

41
42 SWAT personnel then moved towards the suspect vehicle on the passenger side, while
43 inside the ARV. As we approached the passenger side of the vehicle, I could see the

1 suspect sitting in the driver seat of the vehicle, slumped over on his right side. I could
2 clearly see the suspect's left hand, and observed it was empty, but I was unable to see
3 his right hand.

4
5 Based on the fact the armed suspect had shot at Officers, the fact we were unable to
6 see if the suspect had a weapon in his right hand, the fact we were unable to
7 determine if the suspect was dead or alive and due to the fear that the suspect was
8 attempting to coerce us to contact him, Sgt. Dehdashtian gave me the approval to
9 deploy the less lethal shotgun in an attempt to gain compliance from the suspect.

10
11 While in the ARV approximately 10 feet away from the suspect, I announced
12 "deploying less lethal" and deployed a drag stabilizer bean bag round from the less
13 lethal shotgun through the ARV's port hole; striking the suspect on his left shoulder. The
14 suspect did not react to the impact of the drag stabilizer round.

15
16 After deploying less lethal, the K9 was deployed. The suspect did not react to the K9.

17
18 After determining the suspect was not conscious, SWAT personnel formulated a plan to
19 exit the ARV and physically clear the vehicle.

20
21 After the vehicle was cleared I was assigned to conduct scene security. I cleared from
22 the scene at approximately 2230 hours. See additional reports for details.
