On Friday, March 9, 2018, I continued with an Officer Involved Shooting investigation. At approximately 0132 hours, I interviewed Riverside Police Department Officer Abel Soria #1567 inside of the Captain's conference room at the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Jurupa Valley station. Present at the time of the interview were Inv. Gomez, Officer Soria with his employee representative Saku Ethir, Deputy District Attorney Chris Cook and DA Inv. Campos. The interview was audio recorded. The following is a summary of Officer Soria's interview. For additional details, refer to the attached transcription.

I advised Officer Soria that I was soley conducting a criminal investigation regarding the incident and that a separate administrative investigation was being conducted by his agency. After consulting with his counsel, Officer Soria agreed to give a voluntary statement.

Officer Soria said he has been a police officer with the Riverside Police Department for the past ten years. At the time of the shooting, Officer Soria was assigned to the METRO unit, or more commonly known as SWAT. Soria has been a member of METRO for approximately two and a half years. Soria started his shift at 0700 hours. From 0730 hours to 1500 hours Soria was conducting active shooter training for department personnel. After training, Soria returned to the METRO office and was briefed by Officer Wright reference information he received about the location of Ernie Saldivar. Soria and his team had tried several times to locate and arrest Saldivar reference a

shooting he was suspected of being involved with. Saldivar also had an outstanding felony warrant for violating his parole. Soria did not have any contact with Saldivar prior to their investigation of the shooting. Officer Wright received information from Det. Brian Adcox, of the Riverside PD gang unit, that Saldivar was at 9931 Willowbrook Rd., and that he was armed with a firearm.

Officer Soria responded to the location with Officer Wright and Officer Lopez in an unmarked van to conduct surveillance of the location. In the event Saldivar left the residence in a vehicle, Officers Park and Pap were in a marked black and white patrol unit to conduct a vehicle stop. If Saldivar left on foot, the officers in the van were going to attempt to apprehend him. Officer Wright drove the van to the location and parked west of the residence on Fox Borough St. on the south side of the street with a direct visual of the garage of the residence. After watching the residence for a short time, Officer Wright saw what appeared to be two male subjects and one female in the garage. One of the male subjects looked like Saldivar, but Soria was not sure because of their distance from the residence. Officer Wright slowly drove past the residence to get a better look at the subjects. As they passed, they were able to confirm Saldivar was one of the subjects in the garage. They continued on to meet with officer's Pap and Park while Officer Monreal arrived and continued surveillance on the residence. The team decided to go to the residence and take Saldivar into custody. Soria was designated to use the less lethal DEF Tech 40 mm if needed. The weapons system fires a sponge like projectile at suspects.


On arrival at the residence, Ofc. Wright was first in the line-up followed by Soria. Officers Pap, Park and Lopez followed behind. They made their approach from the east side of the residence. As they entered the garage, Soria saw Saldivar. Soria said he identified himself as a police officer. Saldivar then walked quickly toward the interior door leading into the residence. Saldivar then reached down with his right hand toward his pocket area as if he was trying to retrieve something and quickened his pace. Soria believed he was reaching for a gun. Soria followed and continued giving Saldivar orders to stop. Saldivar continued reaching in his waistband area and looking toward Soria. Fearing Saldivar was trying to arm himself with a weapon and would harm him or one of his partners, Soria fired his pistol at Saldivar. Soria believes he fired two times at Saldivar. Saldivar continued into the residence, when he again turned and faced Soria while reaching into his pocket. Soria then fired his pistol an additional five to six times at Saldivar striking him. Saldivar fell to the ground on his stomach in the hallway of the residence.

I concluded my interview at 0213 hours. This report was generated to summarize my interview with Officer Soria.
