Narrative:

On Thursday, 12-29-16, at approx., 1855 hrs., I was dispatched with other officers to the Stater Bro's parking lot at the location on a report of a subject acting irrational waving nunchucks around and yelling at himself. Officers Feimer, Hunt, De La Torre and Sgt. Collins all arrived shortly after the call was dispatched and I was still on Arlington Ave., near Phoenix. As I got to Arlington and Magnolia, Sgt. Collins broadcast the subject was at Washington Park and he requested emergency traffic because the subject was armed with a knife. A short time later Sgt. Collins said the subject was detained and they no longer needed emergency traffic. He also requested medical aid for the subject.

I continued toward the call and as I crossed under the 91 freeway, I noticed southbound traffic was stopped at the tracks for a freight train that just started crossing Mary St. Sgt. Collins asked for a unit for transport and I advised I was still on the way, but I was delayed by the train. After the train passed I continued to the call.

I arrived at Washington Park at the same time as Sgt. Milby and entered the south driveway closest to Victoria Ave. I saw the subject was face down on the grass being controlled by Officers Feimer, Hunt and De La Torre. I walked to where they were and I could see the area of the subject's left bicep where the brachial artery would be was pulsing at an extremely fast rate. Officer Hunt told me the subject said he had just used methamphetamine. Officers Feimer and Hunt rolled the subject onto his side to the recovery position to get weight off of his chest. I noticed the carotid artery on the right side of the subject's neck was also pulsing at the same extremely fast rate. Officer Hunt said he could not tell if the subject was breathing. I looked and could not see his chest rising or falling. I checked the carotid artery and could not feel a pulse. We immediately took the handcuffs off the subject, and began lifesaving efforts. Officer Hunt and Feimer alternated performing chest compressions, and I positioned his head to open as much of an airway as possible. I noticed blood in the subject's mouth and I told Officer De La Torre that I had a protective CPR breathing mask in the equipment bag on the front seat of my patrol car. Officer De La Torre came back with the mask at the same time Riverside Fire Department, Engine 10 arrived and they took over life saving efforts.

Officer De La Torre located items inside the subject's wallet that identified him as Dominic Smith, 4-3-1979, S-1 Smith.

AMR and RFD were ready to transport S-1 Smith to Riverside Community Hospital. I followed them to the hospital and could see them performing CPR the whole time. We arrived at Riverside Community Hospital and numerous staff members were waiting. Riverside Community Hospital staff continued lifesaving efforts until Dr. J. Batt, D.O. found no heart activity and they still could not get a pulse. Dr. Batt pronounced S-1 Smith dead at 1953 hrs.

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Narrative, Continued:

After S-1 Smith was pronounced dead, I noticed a nurse was on the phone and I knew she was talking about this incident. I asked the nurse if she was talking to the Coroner's office and she said she was. I spoke to the Deputy Coroner, Deputy Gonzalez (#N4294) and told her a summary of the incident, and that detectives would be responding.

I stayed at the hospital with S-1 Smith. While waiting for investigators to respond I looked up prior booking photographs and the driver's license photograph for S-1 Smith and confirmed this was the subject in this incident.

Detective Wheeler and Deputy Coroner Gonzalez and other Coroner's office officials arrived to conduct their portion of the investigation.

Sergeants Milby and Collins and Officers Feimer, Hunt and De La Torre were all interviewed by investigating detectives about their roll and actions in this incident. See the investigator's report for information on their actions.
