Narrative:

On 02-25-2013, 2100 hours, I was contacted at home by Sergeant Dave Amador. Sergeant Amador informed me that an officer involved shooting occurred at the Pepper Tree Apartment Complex located at 7911 Arlington, Riverside. Sergeant Amador requested that I respond to the complex to assist with the investigation.

I arrived on-scene at about 2140 hours. While at the location, Sergeant Gary Toussaint briefed us on the circumstances to the incident. I then responded to the Magnolia Street Station to assist with witness interviews.

I arrived at the Magnolia Station and met with David Van-Rood in one of the interview rooms. David had been transported to the station by a patrol officer.

I explained to David that I was assisting with the investigation of the incident that took place at the apartment complex. David agreed to speak with me regarding the incident. The interview with David was audio recorded using my Puma digital recorder. The following is a summary of that interview.

David has lived at the Pepper Tree apartments since October of 2011. David said he purchased gas at the Mobile Station which is located at Arlington and Van Buren for his Black Ford Fiesta. David showed me a gas receipt that showed he purchased the gas at 2047 hours. David left the gas station and began driving west on Arlington Avenue towards the apartment complex. He turned north into the main entrance and then turned east towards the east gate entry gate. David drove his vehicle through the east entry gate and began traveling north on the access road towards his parking stall. He noticed two Hispanic male adults standing to his left near a parking stall. The Hispanic males seemed to be flagging him down. David stopped his vehicle next to the Hispanic males to ask them what they needed. David described the Hispanic males as follows;

Hispanic male #1 5'9 to 5'10 tall, thin build, late 20's wearing a green shirt with short hair.

Hispanic male #2 5'7, medium build, 40 to 50 years, wearing a cowboy hat, dark jeans and a light colored jacket.

David did not believe that he has ever seen either Hispanic subject before. David said he spoke with both subjects in Spanish. From the little Spanish he understands, he learned that someone was attempting to steal a car in the apartment complex. One of the Hispanic males pointed north towards a Silver Honda that was parked in a stall north from their location. David drove his Ford Fiesta north towards the Silver Honda. The Honda was parked about 100' before the T junction in the road in an East parking stall. David stopped short of the parking stall and saw the reverse lights come on from the Silver Honda. The Honda backed up and began driving through the complex towards the west exit/entry gate. David followed the Honda towards the west gate.

David said when he arrived at the west gate; he positioned his Ford Fiesta across the driveway attempting to block the Honda between his vehicle and the west gate which was beginning to open.

David believes the west gate malfunctioned, because it was not opening all the way. The suspect in the Honda became impatient and backed the vehicle up towards David's Ford. The suspect was able to make a turn and drive around David's Ford heading north through the parking lot towards the east gate. David got out of his vehicle. When the suspect drove past David he was able to see the suspect driving the Honda. David gave the following description of the suspect;

White male or light skinned Hispanic male, late 20's, wearing a white t-shirt, pocked mark face and possibly having a thin beard.

David did not recognize the suspect and does not believe he has seen him before in the apartment complex. When David got out of his vehicle, he saw a white male officer wearing small black oval glasses standing near a black and white police unit. The officer was in full Riverside Police Uniform and appeared to be about 27 years old. He had a short military style haircut. David said a small group of residents began gathering near the gate. The police officer told them all to move behind a small block retaining wall that is located near the gate. David said he moved behind the block wall with the group of residents.

A short time later, David saw the Honda accelerating back towards the west gate where they were standing. David saw a police car chasing the Honda. The police car had its overhead lights and siren on. David was not sure if the Honda was driving forward or backwards. David estimated the Honda's speed at about 20 miles per hour. As the Honda approached the west gate, David saw the officer wearing the black oval glasses take his handgun out of his holster and point it towards the Honda. He heard the officer yell, "Stop the car. Stop the car"! David said the Honda continued driving towards the officer. The officer had to jump out of the way at the last second to avoid being hit by the suspect. The Honda continued driving through the gate striking the side mirror of the Honda on a metal post. David lost sight of the Honda behind the block wall and then heard a traffic collision. David believed the Honda crashed into a vehicle that was in the parking lot.

David said he looked in the direction of the Honda and saw it driving forward towards the police car that was chasing it through the parking lot. David then heard about 5 gunshots. He saw the bullets striking the windshield of the Honda. David also believes he saw bullets striking the chest area of the suspect driving the Honda. The front bumper of the Honda struck the front drivers side of the police car. He then heard one of the officers yell that he was going to back up his police unit. David saw the police unit that was struck by the Honda slowly back up.

David said he did not see who fired the shots that struck the suspect of the Honda. The block wall that he was standing behind was blocking his view. David could only see the Honda and other police vehicles that were stopped and arriving near the front main Arlington exit.

David said he may be able to identify the suspect that was driving the Honda from a photograph.
