Narrative

I responded to the Magnolia Station to assist with follow-up. While there Detective Medici asked me to observe the charting of the involved officers weapons and to collect any digital recordings from them of the incident.

The following is a synopsis of the charting, which was completed by Evidence Tech Sue Lane in my presence. Photographs of the officers and their weapons were taken prior to the charting. Both officers were in full police uniform and were wearing duty belts complete with holsters, ammo pouches and HT (walkie-talkie) holders:

Officer S. Lopez

Officer Lopez was carrying a Glock, model 22, .40 caliber, semi-automatic pistol (serial [REDACTED] and two spare magazines. The gun was loaded with (1) live round in the chamber and (11) in the magazine. If Officer Lopez's weapon was loaded to capacity prior to the shooting he fired (5) rounds. Both of his spare magazines were loaded to capacity at (15) rounds each. Officer Lopez's gun, and the magazine and ammunition that were found in it, were collected as evidence. His spare magazines were returned to him. He was not carrying a back-up weapon.

Sgt Amador provided Officer Lopez with a new weapon, one magazine and 16 rounds of ammunition.

I also collected Officer Lopez's digital recorder. Officer Lopez had (8) recordings on it. Seven of the recordings were of traffic stops from 02-29-12/03-01-12 and the last recording was of a portion of this incident. I listened to the last two recordings and then downloaded the contents of the recorder onto the RPD server (see my supplemental report for details of the recording of this incident).

Officer Brett Porter

Officer Porter was carrying a Glock, model 22, .40 caliber, semi-automatic pistol (serial [REDACTED] and two spare magazines. The gun was loaded with (1) live round in the chamber and had (15) rounds in the magazine. The gun was loaded to capacity. One of his spare magazines was loaded with (15) live rounds and the other was loaded with (14) live rounds. Officer Porter was surprised to hear one of the magazines was missing a round and said he must have not fully loaded it after his last range day.

Officer Porter's weapon and spare magazines were returned to him.

I inspected Officer Porter's digital recorder and there were no recordings on it.
