On 6/12/13 I attended the autopsy of S-Hopes at the Riverside County Coroner's Office. The autopsy was conducted by Dr. McCormick. RPD Evidence Technician Velin was also present. She took photographs and collected evidence.

Suspect Hopes' physical description

67 inches tall

Suspect Hopes' clothing

Details

Suspect Hopes' hands were cuffed behind his back. Dr. McCormick removed the handcuffs and Hopes' clothing. Evidence Technician Velin collected the handcuffs and clothing.

Leg wounds

Suspect Hopes had multiple dog bites to his upper right leg. Dr. McCormick determined the wounds on his leg were dog bites and there were no gunshot wounds to the leg.

Head wound

Dr. McCormick determined that Suspect Hopes had a single gunshot entry wound to the rear of his head. Suspect Hopes had an exit wound to the left side of his head just behind his left ear. Dr. McCormick found a projectile inside the skull.

Dr. McCormick stated that the projectile appeared to have traveled back to front and slightly left to right.

Cause of death

Pending.

Additional information

On 1/2/14, I was instructed to add the following information regarding a laceration S-Hopes had on his forehead. I contacted Dr. McCormick through e-mail and he stated the following:

- On the anterior aspect of the scalp near the hairline is a 3 1/2" horizontally oriented laceration with branching at the left lateral part of the laceration. The laceration is

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approximately 1/2" in depth down to the underlying bone with approximately 1" of undermining both anteriorly and posteriorly.

Dr. McCormick believes the laceration is a blunt impact injury. He stated he did not believe it was a graze from a gunshot wound.
