Interview of Iris Hyatt

According to Iris Hyatt, she was married to Russell Hyatt but the two were estranged. They had a child together who was approximately a year and a half old. Shortly before Christmas 2008, Iris told Russell he needed to move out. She said he was messing up and cited several incidents. She caught him stealing money from a safe she kept as part of her business. She also caught him with methamphetamine in their garage.

In early December, Russell overdosed on heroin while at work. He had to be revived by paramedics. Because of these incidents, Iris telephoned Russell's parole officer and told him what was going on. Russell ended up going back to prison where he served a short amount of time. He was ordered to attend a drug and alcohol abuse program. When he got out, Russell enrolled in a program called ABC Recovery. The program was in Indio, California.

Around 2 pm today's date(01/17/09), Russell called saying he had been in a fight with someone at the program. He asked Iris to pick him up. She learned there was no fight and Russell had actually been caught drinking. She refused to pick him up but asked a friend to get him. Around 7:30 PM she was cooking in the kitchen. She noticed Russell outside rummaging through their unlocked truck. She was suprised to see him, because as far as she knew, he was never picked up.

Iris spoke to Russell through the front door security screen. She told him to get out of the truck. Russell told her to give him the car keys. He also wanted his wallet and wedding ring. She told Russell she did not want to be married to a dope addict. She told him to leave but he walked up to the screen door. He pulled a small handgun from his pants pocket(front pocket). He put the gun to his head, saying she was going to watch him kill himself today.

Iris never saw the gun before and did not know where he got it. She told him to leave and said she was calling the police. Russell then walked around the East side of the house and entered the door there. He walked into the house and struggled over the gun briefly with her daughter Marquita. He managed to get around Marquita and entered their bedroom. He rummaged through their dresser drawers looking for the truck key and his wallet.

While inside the house, he threatened to kill himself several more times. At one point, he held the gun to his head and began counting. When he reached three, Iris closed her eyes fearing he was going to shoot himself. When he counted past three and reached six or seven, she knew he could not do it. She told tective Turner she knew he was going to make the police do it for him.

When Russell left, he kicked the front door security screen. He began walking W/B on Spruce and pointed the gun at their house. She prayed he would not shoot through the windows because she was holding their baby in her arms. She described Russell as being, "Desperate."

Approximately a half hour later, Russell arrived at the sober living home she operated on Mulberry Street. He called her using the cell phone of a person named Leon. She did not elaborate on the conversation they had.

Leon spoke to her after Russell left the house. Ultimately, Leon told her he heard shots so she got into her truck and drove to the Mulberry House. At that point she learned Russell was dead.

Iris said Russell could have killed everyone in her house but didn't. She believed the police did not have to shoot him, but added Russell brought it on himself. She said Russell was a coward and could not do it himself. She said, "He used you guys to do it."

Iris provided the names of the people	inside her home when Russell was there. She named herself,
her daughter Marquita Brooks,	
Iris believed Jeff Bruce would not pro-	vide information to police because he was on parole . She said Bruce
saw everything, however, he told the	officers he saw nothing when they arrived to the first call at her house.

Iris said Rusell has attempted suicide four times before and was recently prescribed psych medication. She said he was a "Two striker" who pointed a gun at police many years ago. She said Russell was involved in seperate incidents where he was charged with assault on a police officer.

In one incident, Iris said Russell pointed a gun at a cop. He told the officer he was going to run one direction, then told the officer to run the opposite direction. The other incident involved Russell throwing bleach on police officers.

At the conclusion of the interview Detective C. Turner provided Iris his name and contact number. I downloaded the audio recording of the interview on 01-20-09.
