PHYSICAL EVIDENCE EXAMINATION REPORT

I, the undersigned, declare under penalty of perjury: (1) I am employed by the State of California, Department of Justice (DOJ), Bureau of Forensic Services; (2) I conducted an examination of the material described below in the ordinary course of my work as a qualified examiner, according to approved laboratory procedures that include creation of contemporaneous documentation and the technical review of my work; (3) The observable data is set forth in the associated laboratory case record; (4) Any opinions, interpretations, or conclusions in this report are based upon data in the associated laboratory case record and findings listed below.

Note: This laboratory report has been prepared and retained by DOJ in the normal course of business according to DOJ's regular practices and procedures. The Department of Justice Laboratory is accredited by the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors / Laboratory Accreditation Board (ASCLD/LAB).

SUMMARY/RESULTS

The Smith & Wesson pistol in Item H-24 functioned properly during examination and test firing. One of the test fired cartridge cases was entered into the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) database with negative results.

The Ruger pistol in Item O-7 functioned properly during examination and test firing. The test fired cartridge cases have insufficient detail on their primers for entry into the NIBIN database.

EXAMINATION

The Smith & Wesson pistol in Item H-24 has a barrel rifled with 5 lands and grooves with a right twist. Its safeties and disconnecter are functioning. It has a single action trigger pull of 5¾ pounds. The magazine has a capacity of 10 cartridges. I test fired the pistol using Laboratory ammunition. It functioned properly during examination and test firing. I searched one of the test fired cartridge cases against the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network (NIBIN) database with negative results. The image will remain in the NIBIN database to be searched against new cartridge case entries. If an identification is made you will be notified.

The Ruger pistol in Item O-7 and its magazine in Item O-7B were received covered in what appeared to be blood. I washed them prior to examination. The pistol's barrel is rifled with 6 lands and grooves with a right twist. Its safeties and disconnecter are functioning. It has a single action trigger pull of 4¼ pounds and a double action trigger pull of 10¾ pounds. I test fired it using a Laboratory magazine and Laboratory ammunition. It functioned properly during examination and test firing. The test fired cartridge cases have insufficient detail on their primers for entry into the NIBIN database.

Per Detective Wheeler's instructions, I did not examine the remaining items.

DISPOSITION

The test-fires, Items H-24-TF and O-7-TF, will be stored at the Laboratory for five years. All remaining items will be returned to the appropriate agency.
