Details:

On 11/22/13, I was on uniformed patrol in the City and County of Riverside. At about 2327 hours, I heard unit designator A137, which I later learned was Ofc. Hunt, put out traffic on the radio of shots fired in the area of Vine and 1st. I responded with my emergency lights and sirens activated to the scene (3020 E. La Cadena Dr.) and parked south of the suspect vehicle, identified as a tan or gold colored Nissan Altima.

I took a position of cover behind another vehicle which was parked south of the suspect vehicle on the east side of the street. From my position, I could see what appeared to be feet on the ground on the passenger side of the vehicle and I could also see the passenger door was open. I maintained that position until additional officers and Sgt. Wilson arrived. At the direction of Sgt. Wilson, I gave verbal commands to the occupants of the vehicle. The male Hispanic driver and a white female passenger were ordered out of the vehicle and detained without incident. A team of officers led by K9 Officer Feimer advanced on the vehicle and detained S1, who way lying on the ground on the passenger side of the vehicle. No other occupants were located inside the vehicle.

I contacted W1/ [REDACTED] at 3055 E. La Cadena. In a digitally recorded interview, W1 [REDACTED] told me she was standing on the front porch at the residence and saw the suspect vehicle and the police car. She believed S1 was standing in front of the car. She couldn't describe S1 to me because he was wearing a hooded sweatshirt. She heard what she thought was a firework going off and heard someone say it was gunfire. She looked back at S1 and saw him holding a gun. She saw him fire what she estimated to be two or three more rounds. She did not see the officer's reaction or hear the officer returning fire.

I contacted W2/Vivian Hernandez at 3055 E. La Cadena. In a digitally recorded interview, S2/Vivian told me she was playing guitar on the front porch at the residence. She saw the police car parked next to the suspect vehicle, but did not see either car arrive. She saw S1 exit the passenger side of the vehicle holding a gun. She saw blue muzzle flashes coming from the gun and heard two or three shots. She told everyone on the porch to go inside to take cover from the gunfire. She did not see or hear anything else because she went inside.
