Report of Death to Coroner:

On November 23, 2013, around 0028 hours, this office received a telephone call from Sergeant D. Russell, #1094 of the Riverside Police Department. Sgt. Russell was calling to report the officer involved shooting (OIS) death of a Hispanic Male, who was later positively identified by fingerprint comparison as Adolfo Ramirez. Sgt. Russell stated they were currently awaiting the arrival of multiple investigative personnel and that a briefing would be held in approximately one hour.

Around 0040 hours, I received a telephone call from Riverside City Fire Paramedic Steve Wu, #RP4900, Paramedic Wu was calling to report the fire department's information regarding the treatment administered to the decedent. According to Paramedic Wu, they received their call at 2327 hours, and when they arrived on scene, they found Ramirez lying prone on the asphalt with his hands cuffed behind his back; he was pulseless and apneic. Paramedic Wu told me they initially did not see any injury to the back of Ramirez and obtained permission from police personnel to partially roll Ramirez, that is when they observed the front of Ramirez' shirt was soaked with blood, they returned Ramirez to his former position, and placed EKG patches, which revealed a rhythm of asystole in two leads. Paramedic Wu told me he pronounced death at 0003 hours, without further intervention. Paramedic Wu was not able to provide any additional information regarding injuries.

Around 0045 hours, I notified Sgt. R. Escobar, #N4789, of the incident and the known circumstances.

Scene Description:

I responded from the Coroner's Division Perris Station around 0112 hours, arrived on-scene around 0138 hours, and met with multiple personnel from the Riverside Police Department. The weather was partially cloudy with a partial moon, dry and cold; according to the Coroner's unit (11-466) the ambient temperature registered at 48 degrees upon my arrival to the scene.

The scene was described as the parking lot of the Poma Automated Fueling, Inc. Station located at 3020 E. La Cadena Drive in the city of Riverside. At the south end of the parking lot was a Champagne colored four door 1997 Nissan sedan (1CHH175). The sedan was facing north, both the doors on the driver's side of the car and the front passenger door were open. Lying on the asphalt a few feet from the open door was Ramirez. He was prone on the asphalt, his hands were cuffed behind his back; his head was towards the south and his feet were towards the north. Between the open door and Ramirez was a handgun, later identified as a Smith and Wesson .38 caliber six-shot revolver.

Details:

The following details were obtained from the initial briefing provided by Officer M. Cash, #1200, and Det. J. Brandt, #146, upon my return to the scene. Officer S. Hunt, #1680, was on routine patrol in his marked police unit, traveling south on East La Cadena Drive when he noticed someone crossing East La Cadena Drive from a residence located on the west side of the street to a waiting car stopped on the east side of the street. Officer Hunt noted the person, later positively identified as Adolfo Ramirez, walked around the rear of the car and stopped at the front passenger side of the car. Officer Hunt used his spotlight to light up the car,

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and heard a male voice state "Everything is OK officer," then heard gunfire. Officer Hunt was able to exit his unit, return fire with his duty weapon, take cover, radio dispatch of "shots fired", and requested back-up. When other police officers arrived on scene they were able to remove the car's driver, later identified as Jose Estrada, and the rear passenger, later identified as Stephanie Suarez, and take them into custody without incident. Ramirez was observed to be kneeling next to the open door of the sedan with his torso and upper extremities leaning inside the car. Police personnel gave multiple commands to Ramirez to exit the sedan, which he failed to respond to. Officer K. Feimer, #1001, released his K-9 partner, the K-9 grabbed Ramirez' leg and partially pulled him out of the sedan, the K-9 released and then re-grabbed Ramirez' arm and fully pulled him out of the sedan onto the asphalt. Officer's then handcuffed Ramirez' hands behind his back and notified Riverside City Fire personnel to roll in and provide any necessary medical aid.

Interviews were conducted with multiple persons at 3055 and 3079 East La Cadena Drive, for additional information regarding those interviews, please refer to the Riverside Police Department reports. No one answered the door at 3071 East La Cadena Drive, but police personnel stated the residence may be related to this incident as they have multiple contacts with that address. Further investigation was going to be completed.

Officer Hunt told investigators that he believed he fired his Glock .40 caliber semi-automatic handgun two or three times. The weapon was later charted, which revealed two expended rounds.

Officer Hunt further told investigators that he believed two or three shots were fired at him. Two bullet strikes were noted to the marked police unit (#3934); one bullet strike was noted to the driver's front door of the marked unit, just below the American Flag decal and one bullet strike was noted to the top of the driver's front door where the molding frames the door, just below the side mirror. A bottom portion of the side mirror was broken and the matching piece was located on the ground below. When the revolver was later charted, there was one live round, three expended casings and 2 empty chambers located inside the cylinder.

For further information regarding the law enforcement investigation, please refer to Riverside Police Report number P13169168.

Det. R. Wheeler, #303, told me it would be several hours, before they would be ready to have the body examined and processed. I asked to have police personnel call me when they were ready and I would respond out at that time. I cleared the scene around 0229 hours.

Around 0540 hours, Det. M. Medici, #203, called me and told me they would be ready to start processing the body. I told Det. Medici I would be waiting for a day shift deputy to arrive at the office and that we would be responding back to the scene.

Deputy Coroner A. Roberts, #N3700, arrived for her scheduled shift at 0600 hours, and I requested she accompany me to the scene to assist in completing the investigation. Deputy Roberts and I responded from the Coroner's Division Perris Station around 0610 hours, and arrived on scene around 0632 hours. When

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we arrived back on scene we met with Det. J. Brandt. The weather was clear, dry and cool; Coroner's unit (11-466) registered the ambient temperature at 41 degrees at the time of my arrival.

Deputy Coroner's External Examination of Remains:

a) Body Position: Ramirez was found lying in a prone position on the asphalt.

b) Clothing Description: Ramirez was wearing a black jacket, a black long sleeve, button up the front shirt with thin white stripes, a gray t-shirt, black jeans, a black belt with a white metal buckle, gray sweatpants, black socks and blue/white athletic type shoes. Deputy Coroner Roberts and I removed Ramirez' jacket so we could better visualize injuries and complete a more thorough body exam. Ramirez' jacket was placed into a paper bag, which I brought back to the Perris Forensic Center, and Deputy Coroner Roberts placed into the air dry locker. Prior to placing the jacket inside the paper bag a pair of black boxer shorts with green money signs (\$) fell out of the left jacket pocket. The boxer shorts were placed back inside the pocket. The jacket and boxer shorts were later released to the Riverside Police Department along with the rest of Ramirez' clothing.

c) Post Mortem Changes: Rigor mortis was present, consistent with his found position and breakable with significant force in the upper extremities, but unbreakable in the lower extremities. Livor mortis was slight but present, consistent with his found position and barely blanching with hard pressure.

d) Ambient temperature and method used: Ramirez was cold to the touch at 0750 hours, and according to my thermometer the ambient temperature registered at 51.8 degrees at 0750 hours.

e) Identifying marks, scars, tattoos: Ramirez had numerous tattoos to his head, torso and extremities. No obvious marks or scars were noted to the body.

f) Trauma: I noted multiple abrasions to the forehead, I noted multiple small abrasions to the arms, hands, and legs. I noted a small irregular shaped injury to the upper left chest, above the nipple. The injury was approximately 1/2-inch by 1/2-inch; a corresponding hole was noted to both the black and gray shirts.

Other:

I completed a gunshot residue test (GSR) on Ramirez' right hand at 0703 hours, and on his left hand at 0704 hours. I took fingernail clippings from Ramirez' right hand at 0751 hours, and from his left hand at 0755 hours. I drew a blood sample from his bilateral femorals at 0800 hours and took fingerprints from Ramirez' right hand at 0759 hours and from his left hand at 0803 hours. The GSR and fingernail clippings were released to Riverside Police personnel to be booked as evidence. The blood sample was placed inside the body bag and transported to the Perris Forensic Center (PFC) for later toxicological testing.

Fingerprints cards were taken back to the PFC and later scanned to CAL-ID to confirm identification.

Medical History:

Not relevant

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Social History:

Unknown, although multiple drug contacts were noted on his local contacts record. A syringe was found inside his left front pants pocket, there did not appear to be any residue inside the syringe.

Medications:

Unknown. None found.

Documentation:

One hundred and eighty-three color digital photographs were taken at the scene.

Disposition:

On November 25, 2013, Dr. Jennifer Park performed an autopsy on Ramirez. The results of the autopsy were left pending awaiting toxicology and the Coroner Review Process.

Toxicology was performed on samples recovered from Ramirez. For additional information regarding the toxicological findings, please refer to the laboratory report(s).

CAUSE OF DEATH: GUNSHOT WOUND OF CHEST

"I hereby certify that I, Jennifer Park, D.O., Forensic Pathologist, have performed an autopsy on the body of Adolfo Ramirez, on November 25, 2013, commencing at 9:10 a.m., at the Office of the Riverside County Sheriff-Coroner."

ATTENDEES:

Tim Ellis of the Riverside Police Department and Jim Brandt of the Riverside Police Department witnessed the autopsy.

EVIDENCE COLLECTED:

Purple top tube of blood

Projectile consisting of copper-jacketed gray metal core.

CLOTHING:

A pair of black jean pants.

A gray T-shirt.

A black button down long-sleeve shirt.

A pair of light gray sweat pants.

A pair of navy and white sneakers, off body.

A pair of black socks, off body.

Comment: The left lower leg of the jean pants has dried, almost translucent, white substance. The lower left leg pant of the sweat pants has two puncture-like indentations but the material of pants is intact. The distance between these two indentations is 1 inch. The left sleeve of the long sleeve button down shirt has two irregular defects that are 1 inch apart.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY:

GUNSHOT WOUND OF LEFT UPPER CHEST:

An entrance-type gunshot wound is on the left upper chest, 14-1/2 inches below the vertex of the head and 4-1/2 inches to the left of the midline. It is a 1.8 x 1.1 centimeter irregular defect. No soot, stippling or muzzle imprint is associated with the wound.

The projectile passes through the soft tissues and muscles of the left upper anterior chest, through the left 3rd intercostal space, through the upper lobe of the left lung, through the pericardial sac, through the inferior lateral aspect of the left ventricle of the heart, through the left hemidiaphragm, through the fundus of the stomach, through the left lobe of the liver, through the left 11th intercostal space posteriorly, and a deformed copper-jacketed gray metal core is recovered from the soft tissues and muscles of the left lower back, 21 inches below the vertex of the head and 1/2 inch left of the midline.

The wound path is associated with two liters of liquid and clotted blood in the left chest cavity, laceration to the upper lobe of the left lung, contusions to the upper and lower lobes of the left lung, lacerations to the pericardial sac and heart, lacerations to the left diaphragm and liver, a 12 x 8 cm soft tissue and muscle ecchymosis of the left anterior chest wall, and soft tissue and muscle ecchymoses.

The direction of the wound path, with the body in anatomical position, is left to right, downward, and front to back.

BLUNT FORCE INJURY:

A 4 x 3-1/2 inch area of irregular abrasions is on the mid and left forehead and temporal scalp. A 5 x 3-3/4 inch abrasion is on the right forehead and eyebrow area. A 1-1/2 x 1-1/2 inch red ecchymosis is on the right cheek. A 2-1/4 x 1 inch abrasion is on the nose. A 1 x 1 inch abrasion is on the anterior left cheek. The upper lip mucosa has multiple superficial lacerations up to 5 millimeters in greatest dimension. The lower lip mucosa has red ecchymoses up to 6 millimeters in greatest dimension. A 2-1/2 x 1-1/2 inch area of irregular superficial abrasion is on the left neck. Subscalpular ecchymosis up to 1.5 centimeters in greatest dimension is on the left and right frontal scalp. The underlying skull is intact. The individual anterior neck and strap muscles and soft tissues have no injury.

Abrasions ranging from 1/4 inch up to 2 inches are on the lateral and posterior left upper arm. A 3/4 x 1/2 inch abrasion is on the left elbow. A 2 x 1/4 inch red-orange abrasion is on the anterior left upper arm. A 1/2 inch pink ecchymosis is on the ventral mid lateral left forearm. Orange-red perimortem abrasions up to 1 x 1/4 inch are on the ventral medial left wrist and dorsal lateral left wrist. Irregular linear abrasions up to 1 x 1/8 inch in greatest dimension are on the ventral lateral left wrist. The abrasions range from 1-1/4 inch to 1-1/2 inches in greatest dimension, and the distances between these abrasions are 3/4 inch. Two parallel linear abrasions, up to 2 inches in length, are on the dorsal mid left forearm. The distance between the two parallel abrasions is 1/4 inch. Irregular abrasions are scattered throughout the dorsal left hand, ranging from 1/8 inch to 3/4 inch. A 1-1/2 x 1/4 inch scab is on the lateral aspect of the right elbow. A 1/4 inch superficial abrasion is on the dorsal right wrist.

A 12 x 8-1/2 inch area of irregular abrasions, ranging from 1/4 inch up to 3 inches, is on the left knee, medial distal left thigh, and left lower leg.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is a well-developed, well-nourished, approximately 5 foot 4 inch and 145 pound, white male, who appears the reported age of 37 years. The decedent is received in a sealed body bag with a red seal number 0747170 that is broken at 9:10 a.m. The decedent is identified by a Coroner's tag affixed to the right great toe labeled, "Ramirez, Adolfo 2013-10639."

The body is well preserved and refrigerated. Marked rigor mortis is detected in the extremities. Pink-purple livor mortis is on the back.

The scalp has a full crop of up to 2 inches in length, wavy, black hair. Facial hair consists of a mustache and beard stubble. The eyes have brown irides. The sclerae are nonicteric. The bulbar and palpebral conjunctivae have no petechiae. The nasal septum is intact. The oral mucosa and frenula are intact. The teeth appear natural and are in good condition. A cosmetic piercing is in the left earlobe.

The neck is well formed and straight. The chest is symmetrical, and the abdomen is flat. The external genitalia are those of a normal adult male. The penis appears circumcised. The testes are palpable in the scrotal sac. The back is straight and symmetric. The external anus is unremarkable.

The arms and legs are symmetric and normally developed. The fingernails are short due to being previously cut. The toenails are short.

A 1 inch linear scar is on the anterior lateral left upper arm. A 1/2 inch irregular scar is on the dorsal lateral mid left forearm. A 1/4 inch irregular ovoid scar is on the left knee. A 2 inch oblique linear scar is on the right upper chest. Irregular ovoid hyperpigmented scars up to 1/4 inch are scattered throughout the abdomen. Scars up to 1/2 inch are on the anterior mid right lower leg.

Multiple tattoos are on the body. An illegible tattoo is on the left temporal scalp. An illegible tattoo is on the right temporal scalp. A tattoo of "ON-KA'LL M' LA-AHKA" is on the upper mid chest. A tattoo of red lips is on the right upper chest. A tattoo of what appears to be a cross design, skulls, and a woman is on the abdomen. A tattoo of "MIA G" is on the right lateral abdomen. A tattoo of "Sonia," a heart, "Arlene," a heart, and "Olivia" is on the left lateral chest. A tattoo of "Southern United Race" is arranged vertically on the back. Overlying this tattoo is "Victory of Circumstances", also arranged vertically on the back. A tattoo of lips is on the anterior distal left thigh. A tattoo of a woman and a design is on the left lower leg. A tattoo of what appears to be a dragon design is on the dorsal left foot. A tattoo of what appears to be a dragon design is on the dorsal right foot. A tattoo of "Native Mexican" is on the lateral right lower leg. A tattoo of what appears to be two bodies with apparent gunshot wounds is on the dorsal right forearm. A tattoo of an elaborate design, including "Discipline," is around the right arm.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION:

Injury of the anterior chest wall is as previously described. Left hemothorax is as previously described. The rest of the body cavities have no abnormal fluid collection or adhesions. The musculoskeletal system is well developed. The muscles have a normal color and consistency. The sternum, clavicles, ribs, vertebral column, and pelvis are intact.

The anterior neck strap muscles and soft tissues have no injury. The hyoid bone and thyroid cartilage are intact. The thyroid gland is of average size and shape and has a tan, lobulated parenchyma. The larynx and trachea are lined by intact and congested mucosa. The tongue has no injury.

The reflected scalp has injury as previously described. The brain is 1400 grams. The cerebral and cerebellar hemispheres are symmetric. The cerebral gyri and sulci are normal. The cingulate gyri, unci, and cerebellar tonsils are not herniated. The cerebral cortex has no contusion. The mammillary bodies and the cranial nerve roots are well formed and symmetric. The blood vessels on the base of the brain, including the circle of Willis, are well formed and patent. The pituitary gland is grossly normal.

The gray-white matter demarcations are distinct. The gray matter is tan and uniform. The subjacent white matter has no cystic, hemorrhagic, or mass lesions. The central nuclei are well formed and symmetric. The hippocampi are normally formed. The ventricles are normal in size. The cerebrospinal fluid is clear and colorless. The corpus callosum is well formed and intact. The cerebellum, midbrain, pons, and medulla oblongata have no gross parenchymal abnormalities. The substantia nigra is gray-tan.

The heart is 260 grams. Injury to the pericardial sac and heart is as previously described. The epicardial surfaces are smooth and have increased fat. The coronary arteries arise normally from the aortic root, and their ostia are patent. The coronary arteries are distributed normally and have minimal atherosclerosis. The right coronary artery supplies the posterior descending artery. The left free ventricular wall, the interventricular septum, and the right ventricular wall are 1, 1.1 and 0.2 centimeter, respectively. The atria are not dilated, and the atrial septum is intact. The heart chambers are unremarkable. The endocardial surfaces are smooth. The tricuspid, mitral, pulmonic, and aortic valve circumferences are 9.1, 5.5, 8.1, and 6.2 centimeters, respectively. The valves are normally formed and have no fusion, vegetations, or fenestrations. The chordae tendineae are intact and not thickened. The aorta has no injury and is normal in course, caliber, and branch pattern. The endothelial surfaces are yellow and have slight atherosclerosis. The pulmonary vasculature is well formed and patent.

The right and left lungs are 400 and 230 grams, respectively. Injury to the left lung is as previously described. The pleural surfaces are pink-red anteriorly, red-purple posteriorly, and have slight anthracotic mottling. The parenchyma is red to dark red-purple, slight to moderately congested, and has no focal lesions. The pulmonary vessels and bronchi are normally formed and patent. The hilar lymph nodes are normal.

The liver is 1700 grams. Injury to the liver is as previously described. Its capsule is smooth. The parenchyma is brown, has a normal consistency, and has no focal lesions. The vessels of the porta hepatis are normal. The gallbladder contains tan viscous bile and no calculi. The biliary tree is patent.

The esophagus is lined by intact, tan mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 120 milliliters of thick tan fluid and food particles. The gastric mucosa has injury as previously described. The rest of the gastric mucosa is tan and has slightly decreased rugal folds. The duodenum has an intact mucosa. The rest of the small bowel and colon have no obstruction, perforation, or masses. The rectum is normal and contains soft, tan stool. The vermiform appendix is normal.

The spleen is 60 grams. It has a finely wrinkled, purple-gray, and intact capsule. The parenchyma is dark red-purple and congested.

The pancreas is normal in size and has a tan, lobulated parenchyma. The adrenal glands are normal in size and have bright yellow cortices and soft, brown medullae.

The right and left kidneys are 150 and 160 grams, respectively. The cortical surfaces are smooth. The cortices are up to 6 millimeters. The renal vessels are patent. The parenchyma is pale tan and has well-defined corticomedullary junctions. The calyces and ureters are not dilated and drain normally. The urinary bladder contains 300 ml of clear yellow urine and has an intact mucosa.

The testes have no ecchymoses or masses. The prostate gland is pale tan and not enlarged. The seminal vesicles are normal.

SPECIMENS FOR PATHOLOGY: Representative sections of all major organs are retained.


