Narrative:

On 11-16-11 I responded to 10406 Indiana Ave in the City of Riverside, CA for an officer involved shooting. Upon arrival the Metro Team was in the process of clearing apartment #242 and located S/ Alfred Romo deceased inside the apartment. Homicide Detectives were briefed on the incident by Detective Rita Cobb and Detective Sanfilippo was assigned as the case agent. Detective Rita Cobb advised the SACA Unit was serving a search warrant at the location for S/ Romo who was suspected of molesting [REDACTED]. Upon entry into the apartment the suspect appeared with a shotgun and began firing at the detectives. Detectives Laura Ellefson and Phil Fernandez returned fire, while Detectives Cobb and Jeff Jones and Sgt. Raemakers were outside the apartment. I was assigned to interview Detective Jones.

Detective Jones had injured his left foot during the incident and was taken to the hospital prior to being interviewed. It was determined that Detective Jones sustained a broken left foot. Detective Jones was transported back to the Magnolia Station after being treated. Detective Jones had removed his vest at the hospital. Detective Jones was asked to put on his vest and the gun he had during the incident, which was his Glock Model 27. Detective Jones had switched guns and was currently carrying his Glock Model 22. Detective Jones was photographed and his guns were charted. See Detective Dave Smith's supplemental report for details on the charting of the guns. The following is a summary of the recorded interview with Detective Jones.

Detective Jones stated he has been a police officer for approximately 22 years, 8 ½ with Riverside PD, 8 ½ with Oceanside PD and 5 years with San Diego Sheriff Department. Detective Jones is currently assigned to the Sexual Assault and Child Abuse Unit (SACA) for Riverside PD. Detective Jones stated on 11-16-11 he was assisting Detective Laura Ellefson with a search warrant at 10406 Indiana Ave #242 for a child molest suspect. Detective Jones arrived at the Magnolia Police station and was briefed on the operational plan (Ops plan) by Detective Ellefson. Detective Jones said he was provided with a copy of the Ops plan and what they were looking for during the service of the search warrant. Detective Jones said Detective Ellefson advised them that they were looking for S/ Romo and if he was at the residence he would be arrested. Detective Jones said Detective Ellefson was assigned to knock and notice at the door, Detective Fernandez was assigned to breach the door if necessary, Detective Rita Cobb was assigned to make entry, Sgt. Raemakers was assigned as the supervisor and radio and Detective Jones was assigned to the perimeter at the southeast corner of the apartment to watch the windows. Detective Jones was advised there was a handgun that was registered to S/ Romo's wife that was possibly at the location.

Detective Jones stated at approximately 0720 hours he proceeded to the location in his assigned, unmarked unit. Detective Jones was wearing his tactical raid vest with a cloth badge, the word "Police" across the front and in 4" letters "Police" across the back. Detective Jones had his Model 27 Glock handgun in a holster on his side. He had no extra magazines on his person at the time. Detective Jones did not have a digital recorder on him. Detective Jones said the rest of the unit was also dressed in their raid gear. Detective Jones stated the SACA Unit took their assigned positions and approached the apartment. Detective Jones stayed at the 2, 3 corner (Southeast corner) of the apartment while the other team members approached the door. Detective Jones stated he clearly heard Detective Ellefson bang on door announce she was with the Riverside Police Department, that she had a search warrant and that she demanded entry. Detective Jones said he also heard Detective Fernandez announce their presence. Detective Jones said approximately 20-30 seconds passed. Detective Jones said he heard some loud bangs from the area of the door, which described as the door being forced open.

Detective Jones said while he was on the perimeter he did not see any lights on in the apartment and did not hear any movement. Detective Jones said he did not hear any of the other detectives advising there was movement or lights on in the apartment. Detective Jones said he heard that once the door was forced open,

Detective Fernandez continued to announce their presence. Detective Jones could hear Detective Ellefson saying something also. He thought he heard Detective Fernandez saying show me your hands and directing someone to do something. Detective Jones said he then heard a volley of shots, approximately 3-4. Detective Jones said he then heard some more commands and then another volley of shots and then possibly another volley. Detective Jones did not hear a single shot after the last volley of shots stopped. Detective Jones was not able to make a distinction as to what types of guns were being fired, whether it was from a handgun, rifle or shotgun. He said it did sound like more than one gun was firing though.

Detective Jones stated he was not sure where the shots were being fired at and thought they were possible being fired at the area where he was located. Detective Jones said he took cover behind a vehicle in the parking lot. Detective Jones said he went towards the door area to get a peek, but still kept cover in the parking lot area. Detective Jones said he could not see any of the detectives where he was positioned. Detective Jones said he then returned to the southeast corner where he was approximately 20 yards from the apartment. Detective Jones heard the second volley of shots, so returned to the area near the door but still in the parking lot behind a blue truck. Detective Jones said at that point he could see that the detectives were out of the apartment. Detective Jones said he called Detective Ellefson back to where he was so she could get cover behind the truck and a better view of the apartment. Detective Jones said the rest of the unit took cover and held on the apartment.

Detective Jones said Detective Ellefson put out the original radio traffic of 11-99 and that the shots were fired. Detective Jones said he made sure Detective Ellefson was alright and then he went back to his unit to retrieve his other gun a Model 22 that had more ammunition in it. Detective Jones said he also went back to retrieve the plan, because Detective Ellefson had dropped hers near the front door. Detective Jones said he then started setting up a perimeter around the apartment for units responding.

I asked Detective Jones when and how he hurt his leg. Detective Jones said he hurt it when he was running back and forth for cover between the front door and the southeast corner. Detective Jones said he did not remember how he hurt it. He just remembered after the incident that it was hurting when he responded to the command post.

Detective Jones advised that he did not fire either one of his weapons and did not see who fired their weapons in the apartment. Detective Jones' actions consisted of being on the perimeter and after the shooting coordinating responding units.
