**Narrative:**

On 11-16-11, at approximately 0740 hours, I monitored 10-33 radio traffic in regards to a barricaded suspect in the area of Indiana Avenue and Tyler Avenue, in the city and county of Riverside. I arrived at the Magnolia Station and learned the radio traffic was in reference to Riverside Police Department, Sexual Assault / Child Abuse, detectives who had been involved in a shooting while attempting to serve a search warrant at 10406 Indiana Avenue #Q242. At approximately 0815 hours, Sergeant D. Russell contacted me and asked that I respond to the listed address to assist with the investigation. I arrived at 10406 Indiana Avenue, which is the Tyler Springs Apartment Homes for Seniors, and first went to the club house where a command post had been established. After a short time, I was notified the scene (Apartment #Q242) had been secured and the suspect (Alfred Romo) was found deceased inside the residence.

I walked to the parking lot just outside building "Q" where I received a briefing of the incident and was then assigned to assist with processing the crime scene along with Detective J. Simons, Supervising Forensic Technician C. Fuller, Senior Forensic Technician T. Ellis, and Forensic Technician S. Lane. Detective R. Sanfilippo was assigned as the Case Agent and Detective M. Medici as the Co-Case Agent. Sergeant Amador stayed at the scene for supervision.

The scene was video recorded and photographed prior to being processed. During the initial photographs, the Technical Services Unit (TSU) had a robot inside the apartment that was used during the initial response. Evidence items near the robot were photographed, marked, and collected first. The robot was removed and the remainder of the scene processed.

S/ Romo was pronounced deceased at the scene and his body remained there until the scene was processed.

**Scene Description:**

The scene is the Tyler Springs Apartment Homes For Seniors, located at 10406 Indiana Avenue in the city and county of Riverside, California.

The shooting occurred in apartment 242, which is a ground floor, single story, two bedroom, one bath, residence and is located in the south east corner of building "Q". Building "Q" is located in the south west portion of the complex.

Exterior:

The apartment building has a walkway running north / south on the east side that parallels the front of the apartment. There is another east / west walkway that intersects the aforementioned walkway and leads to apartments 242 and 243. 242 is on the left (south) side of this walkway and 243 is on the right (north) side of this walkway and both of these apartments are downstairs. There is also a set of stairs that lead up to apartments 250 and 251.

Along the north / south sidewalk there were two S&W Winchester .40 caliber shell casings (items BL01-BL02) and one live S&W Winchester cartridge (BL03). These casings were near the north east corner of the S/ Romo's apartment patio.

Along the west walkway leading to S/ Romo's apartment door was a black notebook, clipboard, miscellaneous paperwork and a black metal door bang (BL04-BL05). Two additional S&W Winchester .40 caliber casings (BL08-BL09) were found on the sidewalk between S/ Romo's apartment and apartment 243.

On the north side of the walkway leading to S/ Romo's apartment is a planter, which is where three additional S&W Winchester .40 caliber casings (BL06-BL07, BL40) were located.

Interior:

The front door of S/ Romo's apartment was standing open when I arrived and there was damage to the door frame consistent with the door being locked and then forced open. The deadbolt lock was still extended and in the locked position. The front door when opened completely will only open approximately 45 degrees because of a wall behind the door. The front door had bullet strikes in it and one projectile (BL57) was recovered from the door.

The overall interior was orderly as far as living conditions, however; there were several items (walls, furniture, appliances, etc.) within the house that had bullet holes in them and several particles of wood, paint, etc. littered the living room and dining room. The carpet was in good condition other than the obvious blood and an area near the barrel of the shotgun where it appeared the shotgun had been fired, close to the carpet, leaving a hole and black soot.

Living Room:

As you enter the residence through the front door you walk into a living room area that is furnished with a couch, coffee table, end tables, wooden chair, a floor lamp and large entertainment center. The couch appeared to have been moved from the north wall and pushed towards the center of the room. The couch had a red sheet and pillows on it. The couch, sheet and at least one pillow had bullet strikes in them.

On the ground between the couch and the north wall we located six S&W Winchester .40 caliber casings (BL10, BL11-BL16), a pair of black sunglasses (BL11), a canister of pepper spray (BL17) and a projectile fragment (BL41). Six additional S&W Winchester .40 caliber casings (BL18-BL21, BL23, BL42) were found at the far edge of the couch, nearest the sliding glass door, along with another projectile fragment (BL43). An empty Glock 23 magazine (BL22) was on the ground east of the couch and upon further searching another S&W Winchester .40 caliber casing was found under the couch (BL55), and one in the top shell of the floor lamp (BL56), which is in the north east corner of the living room next to the couch. There was also Search Warrant paperwork (BL24) on the couch.

There was a projectile (BL25) and S&W Winchester .40 caliber casing (BL26) on the floor, south of the front door, and one S&W Winchester .40 caliber casing (BL27) behind the opened front door. Shotgun wadding (BL30) was found on the floor between the coffee table and end table in front of the TV. The television had what appeared to be two bullet holes in the screen.

*Dining Room:*

The dining room is to the right (west) of the living room and is separated from the kitchen by a breakfast bar / counter top. There are two metal barstools and one wooden barstool near the breakfast bar. One of the metal stools was knocked over and the other metal stool and wooden stool were standing. The wooden stool has a cloth and pillow on it and there was blood on the carpet below it. Two grey and black sandals were near the wooden stool. The dining room was furnished with a table, four chairs, a large hutch, a small cabinet that held the microwave, a toaster oven, other miscellaneous items, a mini-fridge and another small white cabinet. The countertop, ½ wall to the countertop, at least one metal stool, microwave, small white cabinet and the hutch all had bullet strikes in them.

In the area of the dining room a projectile (BL28) was found on the ground south of the kitchen, another (BL29) under a dining table chair, and a third (BL37) was found under the tread of the robot. A projectile fragment (BL38) was found under the dining table and another east of the shotgun (BL39). There was a 12 gauge SuperX (9) pellet shotgun shell (BL31) in the dining area just south of the kitchen, a shotgun wad (BL32), and a Remington 12 gauge shotgun with possible blood (BL33) on it found on the ground east of the dining table where it leads to the hallway. The shotgun was loaded and had a SuperX (9) pellet shell in the ejection port (BL33A). The shotgun had a torn yellow Post It note taped to it that said, "Loaded Ready to Go Safety On". A copper jacket (BL34) was located on the ground west of the shotgun and east of the dining table. A projectile (BL35) was found on the ground in the hallway south of S/ Romo's head.

Numerous projectiles were recovered from items within the living room and dining room. These projectiles were removed from under the carpet, the wall behind the TV, the top shelf in the cabinet under the mini-fridge, the small crockpot on the top shelf in the cabinet under the mini fridge, the support beam of the cabinet under the mini-fridge, the bottom shelf near the right door in black cabinet and the top back board of the hutch. In the area of those projectiles several fragments were found as well (BL44-BL52).

*S/ Romo's body:*

S/ Romo was laying on his right side in the hallway with his head to the south (near the entry of the front room / office) and his feet to the north. On the east side of the hallway were shelving units that held books and miscellaneous items.

S/ Romo was wearing a blue sweatshirt, a brown t shirt, blue jeans, white socks but no shoes. His clothing was bloody with a substantial amount of blood on the lower right pant leg, the buttocks, and his socks were bloody. The clothing had holes in them consistent with bullet holes. S/ Romo did not appear to have any gunshot wounds consistent with a shotgun.

S/ Romo had a black and yellow flashlight (BL53) under his stomach area and a book titled "Encyclopedia of Medical Self~Help" (BL54) near his head / face.

The carpet leading from the dining area to S/ Romo's body appeared to have blood smears and was lying down as if S/ Romo had been on the ground and possibly dragged himself to his current location.

S/ Romo's body was examined by Riverside County Sheriff-Coroner Deputy Donovan (#N4255) and Deputy A. Smith at the scene before being transported.

*Office:*

Inside the front room / office we found a Sterling .25 caliber semi-automatic handgun Serial# 037578 (BL36) on top of the desk, which is along the east wall of the office. The weapon was loaded and had one .25 auto cartridge and a magazine with two additional .25 auto cartridges in it (BL36A).

*Master Bedroom:*

No items related to the shooting were recovered from the master bedroom.

*Bathroom:*

No items related to the shooting were recovered from the bathroom.

Refer to Detective Simons Search Warrant Service report (P11-169201) for details of other items located / recovered from the within the office and master bedroom.

S/ Romo's body was removed from the scene and transported by coroner personnel to the Riverside County Sheriff-Coroner's office.

Riverside Police Department personnel cleared the scene at approximately 2030.

All evidence items were photographed and measured prior to being collected.




