Updating this definition better reflects the realities present in our communities, ensuring that individuals at risk of significant harm receive the help they need.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT & BOND

Advances a general obligation bond to fund the construction of 10,000 behavioral health beds in communities across the state.
