### EXPLORING THE INN: GOLDEN TILE PANELS Mission Inn Museum

Join the Mission Inn Museum as we bring you an inside look at Riverside's own Mission Inn Hotel & Spa! This month we will be exploring the technique that artisans used to create the Rayas Retablo, located in the St. Francis Chapel of the Mission Inn. The magnificent gilded altarpiece is carved from Mexican cedar and covered in many layers of very thin gold leaf, allowing it to shine in the candlelight of the original owner's family chapel. The Retablo was acquired by Frank Miller in the early 1920s and is one of the most striking objects at the Mission Inn. We will be using gold foil and special shaping tools to create our own mini panels that resemble the designs of a gilded carving!



### CHINESE NEW YEAR AND MORE! Riverside Art Museum

Storyteller extraordinaire, Karen Rae Kraut, is back at RAM! Welcome the Chinese New Year (it's the Year of the Sheep) as Karen performs the Kamishibai (paper theatre) story, "How the Years Were Named," which explains how the 12 Years of the Chinese Zodiac each received their special animal at 2:00 p.m. The Gluck Contemporary Dance Ensemble will also be on hand to present Morph 'n Mix, an original choreographic work that samples, alters, loops, and mashes up an exciting array of movement. Co-directors Professor Wendy Rogers and Gluck Graduate Fellow Rosa Rodriguez Frazier have collaborated with this select group of undergraduate dancers to create a dance that incorporates impromptu changes with each performance.
