## Santa Ana River Trail Sewer Line Replacement

The Santa Ana River Trunk Sewer begins at the Water Quality Control Plant and generally flows along the Santa Ana River Bike Trail to Tequesquite Avenue. The sewer line was constructed in the 1940s and 1950s and currently serves approximately 50% of the City's population. Unfortunately, the pipeline is approaching the end of its service life, therefore, a two phase replacement project was developed. Phase 1 of the project was completed in January 2013 and replaced the line between the Wastewater Quality Control Plant and Martha McLean/Anza Narrows Park. Phase 2 of the project, between Martha McLean/Anza Narrows Park and Tequesquite Avenue, is expected to begin this fall.

**Approximate Start Date:** September 2015

**Approximate Construction Period:** 18 months

### Project Details:

- Replace 10,540 feet of sewer line
- Realign two curves along the Santa Ana River Trail behind Grassy Trail Drive
- Estimated cost is \$24,850,000

The trail will be closed Monday at 7:00 a.m. and reopened Friday at 3:30 p.m. for weekend use. A detour for cyclists to use during the week is identified on the map below. Detour signs will be installed along the route.
