REWARD OFFERED IN HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION

RIVERSIDE, CA – This past Tuesday night, the Riverside City Council approved a resolution offering a reward in the amount of \$10,000, for the duration of 60 days, for information that leads to the identification and apprehension of the person or persons responsible for the murder of Linda Ferguson.

Early morning on Thursday, June 6, 2019, at approximately 3:45 a.m., a shooting took place at a residence in the 3800 block of Cedar Street, located in the Downtown neighborhood of Riverside. The investigation revealed that one of the occupants of the residence witnessed and interrupted a vehicle burglary on the street outside his home. Just prior to the suspects fleeing the area in a vehicle, one of them fired a single gunshot at the home, striking Ms. Ferguson. She was critically wounded and died from her injuries at the hospital.

Although forensic evidence was collected in the area, the investigation conducted so far has developed few leads. Detectives believe there may be witnesses or people with information related to this crime who have yet to come forward.
